Spring is a great time to get outside, soak in some sunshine, and enjoy the natural beauty of our region. It's a time to watch the buds flower on trees that have lain dormant all winter, and to anticipate the shade canopy the leaves will provide as we head into the warmer summer months, shade that provides the perfect spot to read.

Our theme for this spring is "Read Outside." You can see that I immediately started thinking about reading outdoors, taking the theme literally.
